This Sunday, 13th October, Pope Francis is consecrating the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Holy Father has asked that the statue of Our Lady of Fatima be brought to Rome for this most significant occasion. The Consecration expresses our desire to share Mary's complete openness to God and neighbour. To be consecrated to Marys' Heart is to set out on a pilgrimage to her heart, so that with her we may love God more fully and our neighbour in ways that are real.

Pope Francis reminds us that devotion to Mary is at the heart of our Catholic faith. He has expressed his own devotion in practical ways. For example, by praying before the image of the Blessed Virgin in St. Mary Major's Basilica on the morning after his election. His Holiness tell us: "This is how it is with Mary: if you want to know who she is, you ask theologians; if you want to know how to love her, you have to ask the people."

As Pope Francis makes this new consecration of the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, he will surely be praying especially for those people most in need in our world – for those longing for peace, for the poor and the marginalised, for the sick and bereaved, for those who feel alienated from God. To her Immaculate and Sorrowful Heart he will commend these and all of us. As the Holy Father makes this consecration, let us ask Mary to show us how we might more faithfully follow her Son, Jesus, and so love God and our neighbour wholeheartedly.

Perhaps during this week and throughout the month of October you might find time to ask the special intercession of the Mother of God for your own intentions, whatever they may be. As well as this think about and pray for all those who suffer, especially the people of Syria. We cannot imagine what it must be like for a country to be torn apart by civil war, to see your family suffer and to witness the destruction of all that you have worked for. This must be heart-breaking. Please ask the intercession of our Lady as you pray the Memorare.

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided.

Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me.
