Becoming a disciple of Jesus can be thoroughly unsettling. One has no idea what will be asked and how one will cope. It is a perilous adventure, especially alarming for our timid culture with its fear of risk and obsession with health and



safety. The great preachers of the gospel are those who are not afraid to lose control of their lives.

God's love often propels us into deep waters where we must either sink or trust in him. To love anyone is risky. Who knows what it will involve? The gospel is an invitation to lose control of our lives. This frightening call is the heart of Pope Francis' spirituality: 'There is no greater freedom than that of allowing oneself to be guided by the Holy Spirit, renouncing the attempt to plan and control everything to the last detail, and instead letting him enlighten, guide and direct us, leading us wherever he wills.' 'I have the sense of being in someone else's hands, as though God were taking me by the hand.' So the Christian imagination should defy the timid neuroses of our time.

Christianity is risky and it demands a response from us if we accept that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and that he invites us to place our lives in his hands. This was the experience of the disciples at Pentecost when they received the Holy Spirit that propelled them on a mission to the whole world. Initially they were reluctant to go and leave the small and familiar community of the early Church in Jerusalem. Finally, it was persecution that dislodged them. God sometimes resorts to desperate means.

800 years ago, St Dominic reflected on his desire to send his friars out as missionaries. Though he was concerned about their future he came to the conclusion that 'Stored grain rots'. In other words we have to leave the comfort of the familiar in order to encounter the challenges that the gospel throws at us so that we can grow in Christian discipleship. This means that we must dare to grapple with questions and situations to which we have no easy answers and try new ways of living the gospel that may well fail. When the waters of the deep threaten to overwhelm us, then, like Peter further on in the adventure, we shall find a firm hand reaching out to lift us back into the safety of the boat. Let us not be afraid.

Parish Pilgrimage to Poland No other Polish city comes close to matching Krakow for its sheer wealth of religious, architectural and artistic treasures. Our tour of Krakow will include a visit to the cathedral where Pope John Paul presided as Archbishop before his election to the papacy. We will see Wawel Castle, the seat of Polish Royalty for over 500 years and we will stroll through the winding streets of Krakow's Old Town, with its soaring Gothic churches and medieval town square - the largest in Europe. We intend to go to the Wieliczka Salt Mine, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, where we can wander through labyrinthine tunnels and marvel at an ornamented underground temple built entirely of salt. We will visit Auschwitz, scene of so much suffering and persecution. We will also make our way to Our Lady's shrine at Czestochowa, home of the monastery of Jasna Gora where the famous image of the Black Madonna is kept. Our pilgrimage will take place in the first week of June and the price will be confirmed within the next week by Pax Travel who will organise the pilgrimage and provide a guide.
